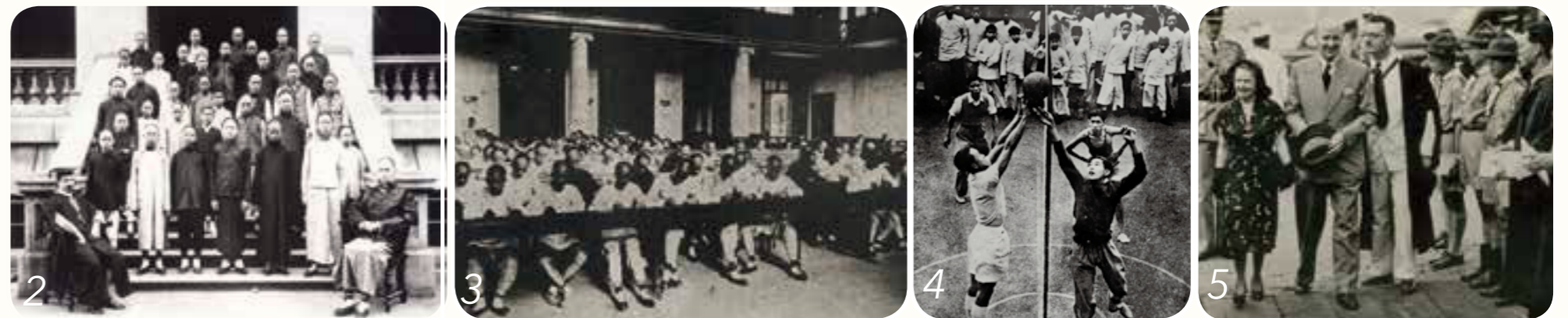
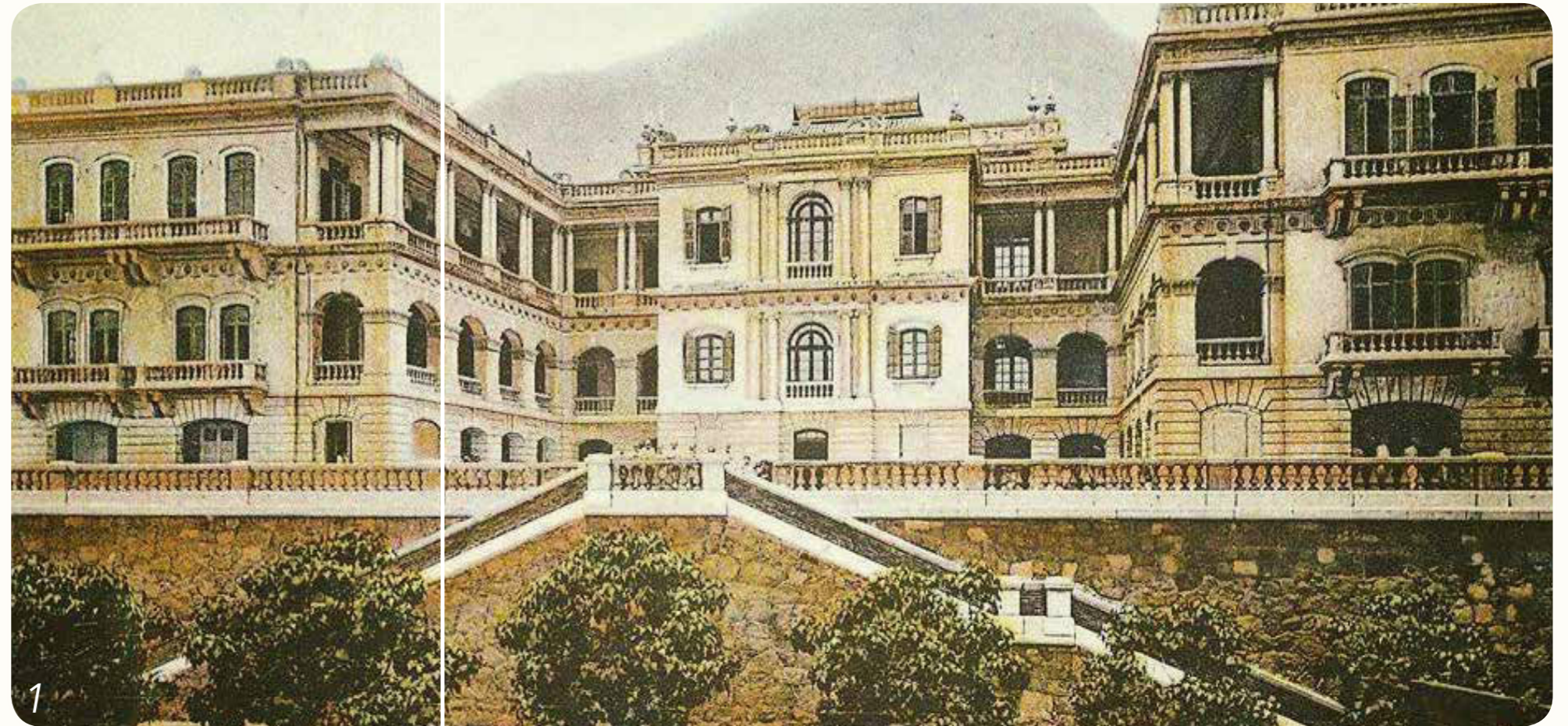

SCHOOL HISTORY

Queen's College, originally named the Central School, is the first government school set up in Hong Kong in 1862. First located in Gough Street, Central, it provided western education to both Chinese and foreign students. In 1889, the new school building, at the junction of Aberdeen Street and Hollywood Road opened and the school was known as Victoria College. It was renamed Queen's College in 1894 and moved to the present site in Causeway Bay in 1950.

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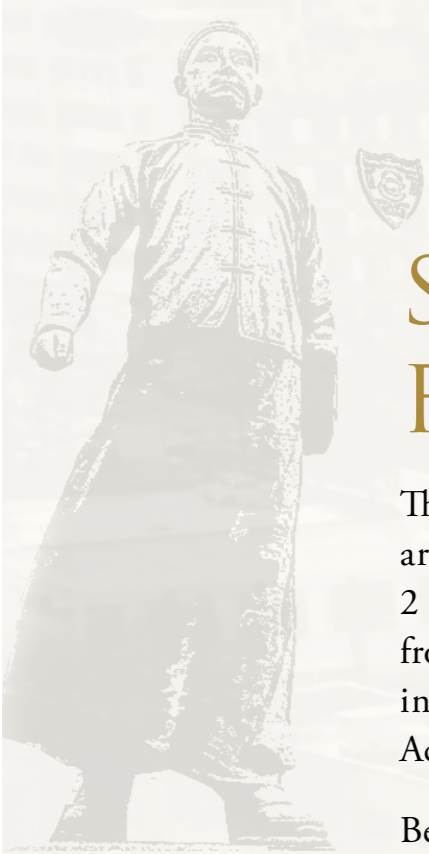

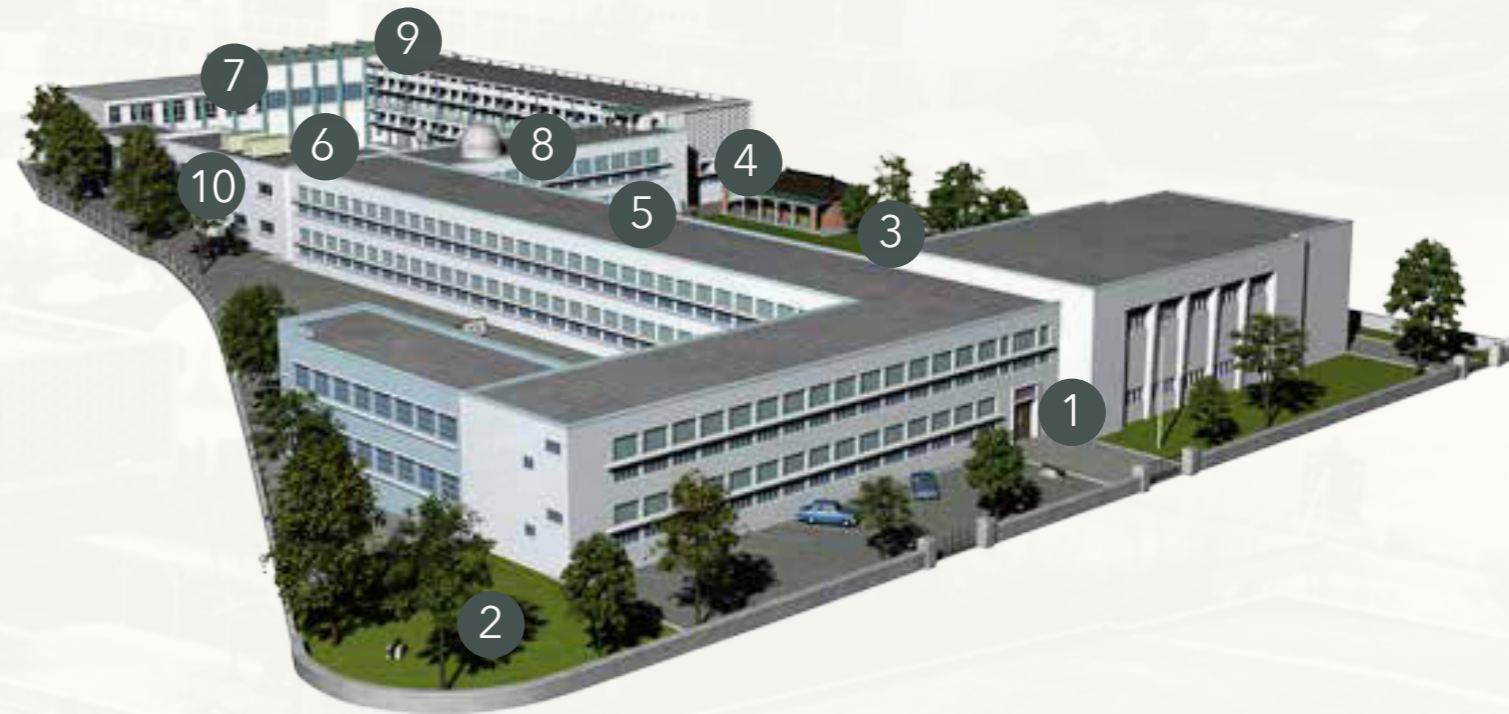




SCHOOL CAMPUS AND FACILITIES

In Tiers 2 and 3, students take part in local and international competitions and various programs offered by local universities every year, including the University of Hong Kong and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Careers & Life Planning Team

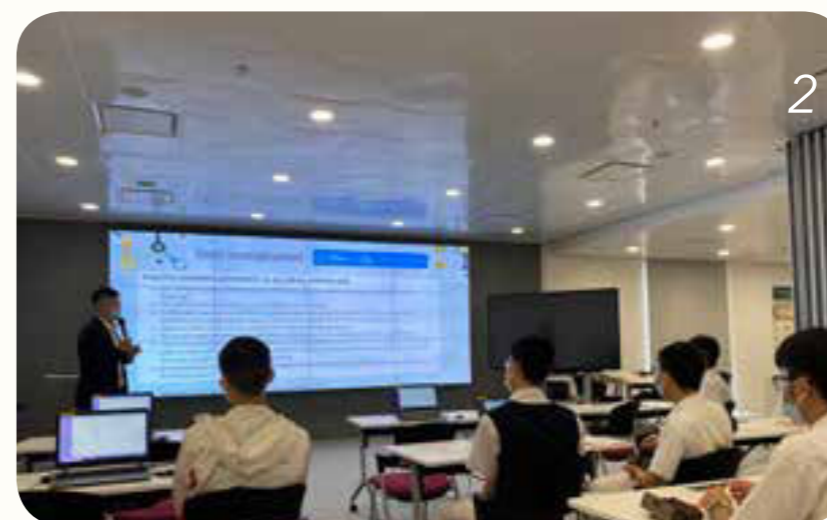

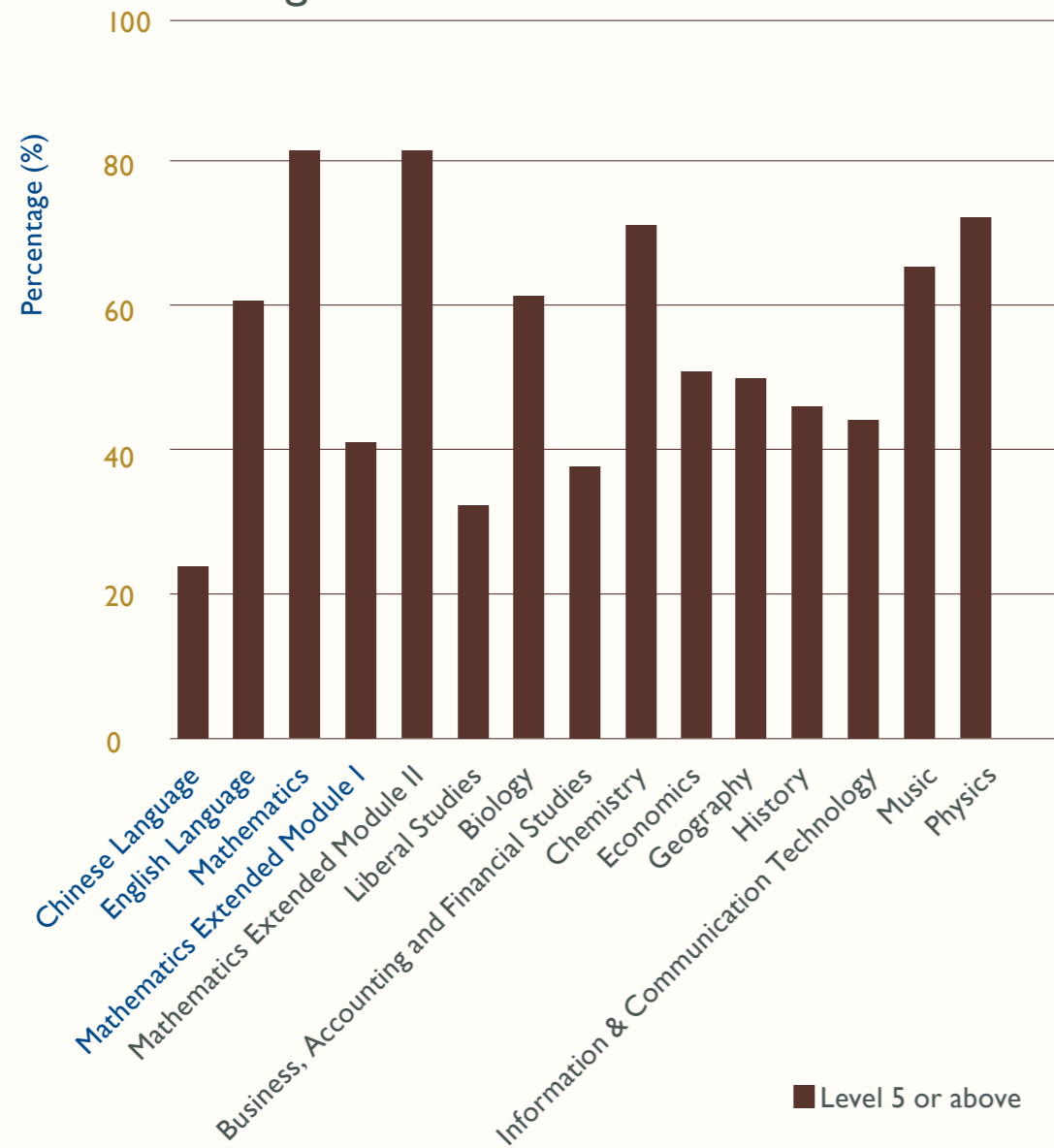

Percentage of students attained Level 5 or above

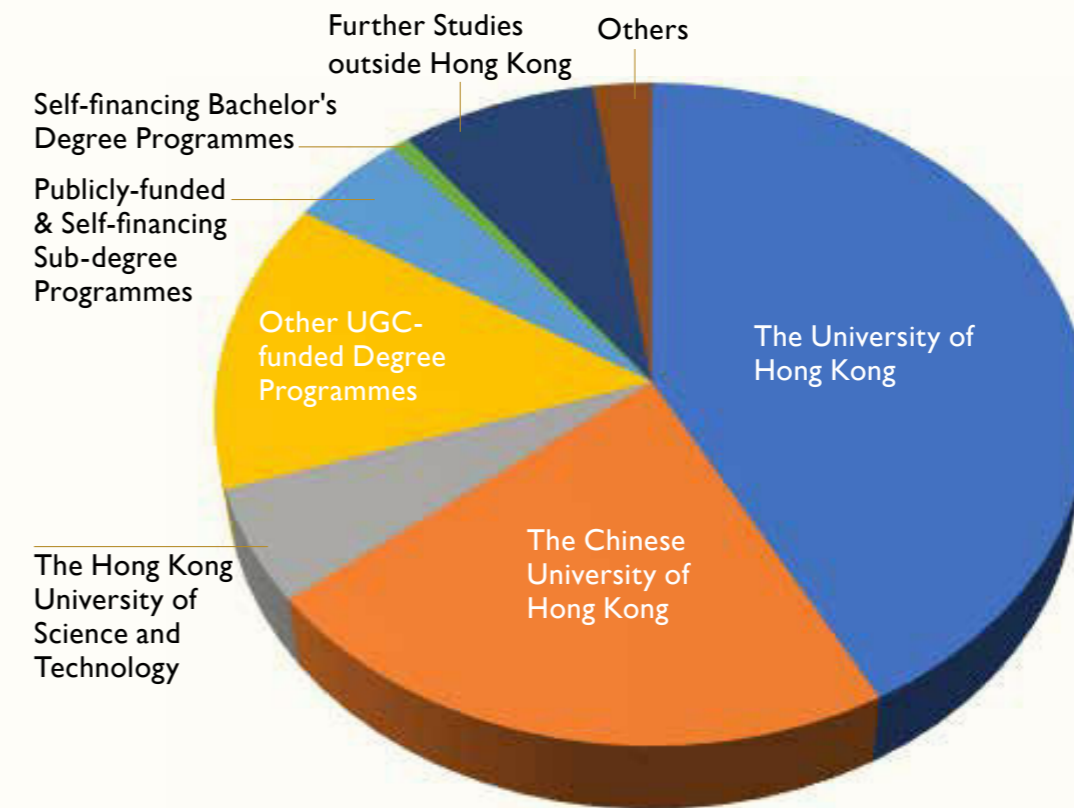
